




Elder George Jeffries' Home




First church meeting place was in the upper room over Elder George Jeffries' home on High Street near Mound Street in the early 1800's.

South side of Mound Street, between High and Front Streets






First Sunday School held here, June 10, 1832

Third meeting house on east side of Front Street just north of Mound Street.


May 6, 1832 to April 4, 1837








Interior of Rich Street church



Into the 1850's

- Fourth pastor served during a cholera epidemic
- Catholic priests and Rev. Cheney were the only ministers not to leave the city
- Rev. Cheney's wife died of cholera

1850's Events

- Fifth pastor, Rev. Henry G. Davis February 1853 to March 1858
- 1853 Central Baptist was organized...three years later,
- 1855 independent Baptist returned
- 1856 Central Baptist members returned to First Baptist Church

 July 1866 to Dec 1867




Into the 1870's

Feb 1868 to June 1871

- Church building was reconstructed
- 1871 High Street Mission begun: Russell St. Baptist -Central Baptist

Central Baptist is currently Located on Frank Road in West Columbus

- First Baptist's 9th pastor, Rev. I.F. Stidham
 October 1872 to 1884
- Jun 25, 1876 Battle of the Little Big Horn
- 1884 est. 20th Street Mission
 Heldreth Baptist - Linden
 Baptist - Karl Road Baptist



The 1880's

- First Baptist's 10th pastor, Rev. Ira J. Bailey March 1885 to July 1886
- Resigned because of health
- Died of tuberculosis

- First Baptist's 11th pastor, Rev. George B. Simons
 Nov 1, 1886 to Oct 1890
- Nov 17, 1889 West Side Mission Memorial Baptist

- First Baptist's 12th pastor, Rev. B.F. Patt

- 1892 Parsons Avenue Mission Tabernacle Baptist -S. High St. Baptist - Lockbourne Baptist
- 1894 Ohio Ave Mission




- First Baptist's 13th pastor,
 Dr. H.H. Barbour
 March 1, 1896 to 1903
- Dec 10, 1898 Treaty of Paris ends Spanish-American War



- Fifth meeting house on the front of the Broad Street lot; used while Broad Street church was being built.
- Jan 10, 1897 to Mar 5, 1899 "Tabernacle"
- Building cost \$1,949.75
- Land cost \$14,000



- Nov 3, 1897 ground broken
- Jun 1, 1898 cornerstone laid
- Mar 24, 1899 first service
- Cost of \$50,000
- Building sold Aug 18, 2005 after 106 years for \$975,000



- WWI ends 1918




The 1920's

- First Baptist's 18th pastor,
 Dr. Daniel F. Rittenhouse
 May 1919 to 1928
- May 1919 fire damages church
- 1922 entered electronic age
- Sept. 24, 1922 Radio station "WMAN"
- Jun 28, 1925 First Baptist committed to a building program
- Jan 11, 1926 talks to buy the Broad St. ME Church broke down
- Aug 28, 1926 last service at Hartman Theater after 5 months there










Youth Room & Church Offices

- Dedication Service January 6-9, 1927 of reconstructed sanctuary & Estey organ




• While the Broad Street church was being remodeled in 1926, services were held first at the Hartman Theartre *right*




